



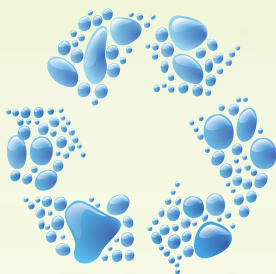

CITY OF ST. JOHN'S WATER CONSERVATION ORDER

This Order applies to all outside uses of water in the City of St. John's. The Order was introduced to promote the wise use of our water supply systems.



WHEN CAN I WATER MY LAWN?



EVEN STREET NUMBERS

Lawn and garden watering with a sprinkler system is restricted to the hours between **6 am – 8 am, 8 pm – 10 pm, Tuesdays and Saturdays.**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When can I water my lawn and garden with a sprinkler?

If your street number is EVEN, you can water between 6 am – 8 am, and 8 pm – 10 pm, Tuesdays and Saturdays.

If your street number is ODD, you can water between 6 am – 8 am, and 8 pm – 10 pm, Thursdays and Sundays.

When can I wash my car or clean my windows and siding?

You can wash your car or clean your windows and siding any time as long as you use a hose with a shut-off nozzle.

When can I hand-water my garden?

You can hand-water your garden with a watering can or hose with a shut-off nozzle at any time.

When can I water my new lawn?

You can water your new lawn between 6 am – 8 am, and 8 pm – 10 pm every day for a period of 60 days following installation. Please call 311 to register your new lawn with the City.

Under the city of St. John's Act, failure to comply with this Order may result in prosecution and imposition of a **fine of up to \$5,000**. The City also has the authority to turn off the water supply to anyone who does not comply with this Order.

Commercial car washes and commercial high-pressure water uses are exempt from this Order.
